

# Process to achieving the Pilot Chemical Rating

To achieve this Rating you need to have first provided evidence of a NZ PPL (Private Pilot Licence) or CPL (Commercial Pilot Licence), prior to acceptance to attend the course, if you are flying a manned aircraft. This does not apply to UAV/Drone operators

The steps for this process are outlined below. These procedures are required and must be met:

### Step One:

• On application to Educhem Ltd, you will receive a Study Guide Training Manual. This Guide consists of a number of chapters, most with a set of multi choice questions at the end of each applicable chapter, which you need to answer and send back to Educhem Ltd **prior to the course.** 

### Step Two:

 Initial Rating course: Attend a 3 x day training course which includes both practical and theory components. This is at a cost of \$4635.00+gst. This course contains written, oral and practical assessments.

### What you need to bring to this course

- Your Study Guide manual and resource booklet
- Some warm clothing as there are out door practical training sessions
- Manned aircraft pilots need to bring their log books
- UAV operators are free to bring their drone to the course if they choose

## Step Three:

After successful completion of the course, you will receive:

- Your logbook sticker showing validation of Part 61
- Educhem Ltd certificate showing attendance at the Pilot Chemical Rating course

NB: Demonstration of flying and aircraft are not part of the requirement for the Chemical Rating -that part will be undertaken with your E Cat instructor.
