

#### Effective Date: 1st December 2017

The following information must be recorded **AFTER EACH APPLICATION** for tracked substances that trigger Classes 6.1A & 6.1B, this is a requirement under the Hazardous Substances Regulations 2017, and the EPA Hazardous Property Notice 2017.

#### **Application Records:**

- 1. Date of application.
- 2. Name of the Applicator and their position in the company
- 3. Applicators address
- 4. Name of the Agrichemical
- 5. The Hazard classification (6.1A and or 6.1B)
- 6. Amount of the agrichemical applied.
- 7. Location where the agrichemical was applied.

### Storage

Movement of the hazardous substances that trigger 6.1A & 6.1B,

- Amount of Product received.
- Amount of Product used. (use spray application records)
- Amount of Product left in stock.
- Location of the products which records being available within 2 minutes of WorkSafe arriving at your place.
  Physical location of the products is required within 1 hour of WorkSafe arriving at your place.

### **Disposal of container**

Use Agrecovery for this function.

Ensure that empty containers are Triple Rinsed, labels on and lids removed.

## Disposal unwanted products

If a tracked agrichemical has been disposed of, the following must apply;

- The manner of the disposal.
- The date on which the transfer took place.
- The amount of the agrichemical disposed of.
- The location where the agrichemical was disposed of.

# Transfer to another place

If you're going to transfer the tracked agrichemical to another place, the following must be included.

- The product name(s)
- The identify and address of the PCBU with management and control of the workplace to which the tracked agrichemical is transferred.
- The date on which the transfer occurred.
- Records of transferred agrichemicals must be kept for 12 months.
